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Wawa to Celebrate Grand Opening of First Store in Staunton, VA

Why: After serving the Virginia community for over 25 years with more than 125 stores, Wawa is thrilled to continue its expansion westward. Over the next ten years, Wawa plans to reach a total of 60 stores in the I-81 market. To build each store, Wawa will invest approximately \$7.5 million and employ, on average, 140 contractors and local partners. Once open, each store will employ an average of 35 associates, with Wawa expecting to create thousands of long-term new jobs as a result of expansion westward in Virginia.
