Wawa Expansion Plans in Kentucky, Ohio and Indiana

Wawa is expanding to Kentucky, Ohio and Indiana and will begin opening stores this Spring and Summer in all three states. In 2025, Wawa will open dozens of stores before the end of the year, launching long-term expansion and commitment to thousands of new jobs and strong community partnerships. To build each store, Wawa will invest more than \$7.5 million and employ, on average, 140 contractors and local partners.
